- Explore the Museum and discover objects from all around the world
- Understand that all humans need and use similar objects
- Appreciate the wide range of materials used to make objects
- Enjoy a first visit to the Museum

- What all humans need for survival
- Similarity and diversity of humans around the world

## Pre-visit activities

- Visit the Pitt Rivers website at prm.ox.ac.uk
   What is the Museum about? How is it different from the Oxford University Museum of Natural History next door?
- Consider the range of materials that can be used to make an object such as shoes, jewellery or bowls.

## Post-visit activities

- Imagine what objects you might pack in a suitcase if you were going on a long journey around the world.
- Choose 5 objects which would help you to survive on a desert island.
- Research how people in different countries solve the same problem, such as creating shelter or making clothes.
